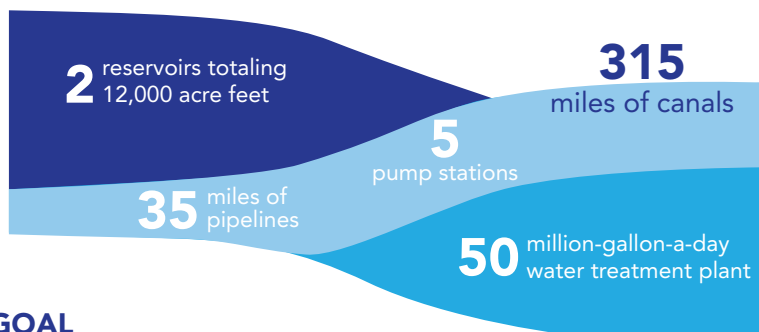
WHO WE ARE

Water is a limited resource, and demand across Texas continues to grow. GCWA will work to continue to secure reliable sources of quality water for our customers.

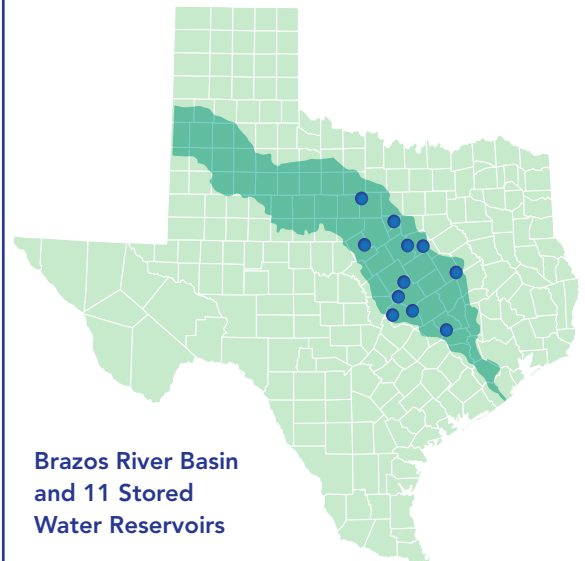
HOW YOU CAN HELP CONSERVE WATER

- Limit outdoor watering to twice a week or less
- Adjust sprinklers to avoid runoff
- Turn off sprinklers when it's raining
- Use drip irrigation
- Don't let the hose run
- Cut back on water use inside the house too
